## EYFS AT WOODLANDS

The EYFS statutory framework 2023 is mandatory for early years providers in England. It sets the standards that all early years providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well; ensures children are kept healthy and safe; and ensures that children have the knowledge and skills they need to start school.

The Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) is a statutory requirement to be taken in the first six weeks in which a child starts reception. Further information can be found by following the links below.

The EYFS profile (EYFSP) is a statutory assessment of children's attainment at the end of the early years foundation stage. The EYFSP handbook supports early years practitioners in making accurate judgements about each child's attainment. It should be used to help complete and moderate early years foundation stage profile assessment judgements, so that outcomes are accurate and consistent across all early years settings.





In the final term of the year in which the child reaches age five, and no later than 30 June in that term,

the EYFS Profile must be completed for each child. Each child's level of development must be

assessed against the early learning goals (see Section 1). Practitioners must indicate whether children are meeting expected levels of development, or if they are not yet reaching expected levels

('emerging'). This is the EYFS Profile.

Schools must share the results of the Profile

with parents and/or carers
